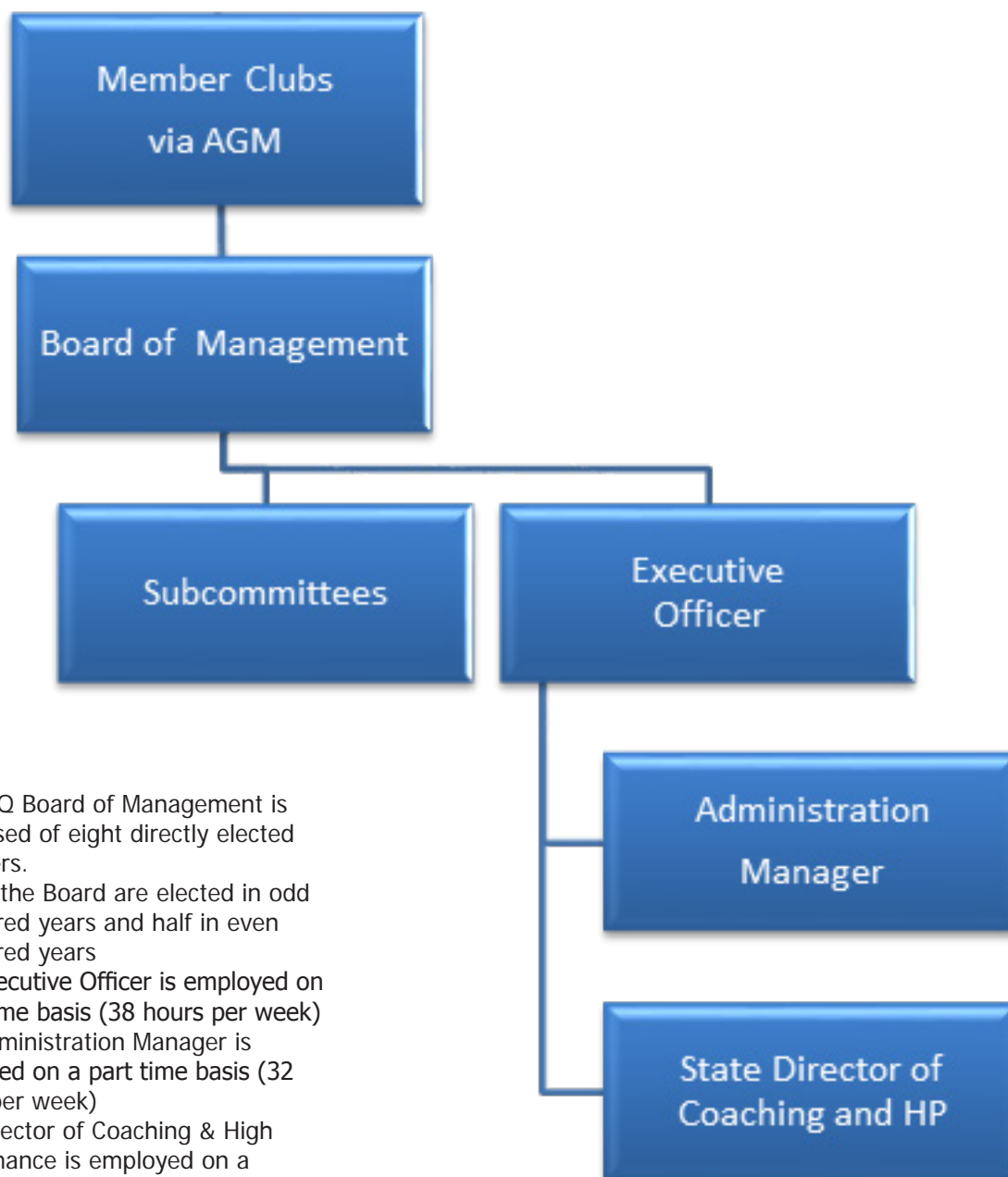

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Trevor Barrett

This annual report represents a summary of various activities involving Table Tennis Queensland, its individual members and member associations during 2016. The detailed reports in the following pages outline the developments in the numerous aspects of our organisation and I am pleased to commend this report to the clubs and associations. I trust that the information in the subsequent pages will enable members to see that Table Tennis Queensland is a financially healthy and active organisation aiming to meet the needs of its members.

I would like initially to formally acknowledge the contributions of our Executive Officer (Jason Walsh) and Administration Manager (Karen Carruthers) over the past year. Once again both Jason and Karen have contributed significantly to Table Tennis Queensland during 2016, again often exceeding the requirements of their employment, and we thank them for their efforts. I would also like to thank all members of the Board for your voluntary contributions to the management of Table Tennis Queensland during 2016.

The up-coming AGM sees the completion, as part of our succession planning, of the two year terms of several Board members, including myself (Bundaberg), Lionel Rose (Moreton Bay), Terry Morato (Townsville) and Rhonda Miller (Townsville). On behalf of the membership of Table Tennis Queensland I would like to thank those retiring Board members for their contributions and look forward to your continued involvement with table tennis in Queensland.

During 2016 The Board also reluctantly accepted the resignation of Danny Lloyd, a long-time Board member, Vice President of TTQ, and strong supporter of Queensland table tennis. Danny resigned his position due to work commitments, and the Board is very appreciative of, and publicly acknowledges the significant contribution made by Danny

over many years. Danny was replaced as Vice President by Steve Mitchell, and we were also pleased to welcome Martin Solomons to the Board as a Southern Board Member.

Finally in terms of staffing, we were disappointed recently to lose Patrick Wuertz, our State Director of Coaching and High Performance to a private coaching role in Victoria, and I would like to take this opportunity on behalf of the TTQ Board to thank Patrick for his efforts around the state during 2016, and wish him well in his future endeavours. Patrick had a great rapport with players at coaching events and was very successful as Team Manager for Queensland teams at National events. Patrick played a pivotal role in the launching of the Junior training hubs, the first sessions being held at Bundaberg & Wynnum and the NQ session in Townsville in mid-September. We are hopeful that these sessions will provide high level training to our junior elite players on a regular basis. With appropriate and continued commitment from our junior players we will hopefully see the realisation of further improved results at the national level in the coming years.

After a successful year as Patron in 2015, we were delighted to see the Honourable Leanne Donaldson, State Member for Bundaberg, once again accept the role of Patron of Table Tennis in Queensland. Leanne has again been active in attendance at many events during 2016 and we thank Leanne for her continuing support of our sport.

In relation to events, we have once again, in association with various member clubs, successfully staged several major tournaments along with numerous local Association Open events across the state during 2016. Particular thanks must go to the Gold Coast association for hosting the QLD Closed, Brisbane for hosting the Queensland Juniors and Brisbane/Queensland Open, and Townsville for holding the QLD Vets.



It was particularly pleasing to see the numbers of competitors at all of these events being quite high, reflecting the significance of these events in relation to eligibility for selection in Queensland representative teams.

We have also once again seen the continuing development of the annual women's event at Moreton Bay as well as a new women's event in Townsville, both of which were very successful. The emergence of other Veteran's tournaments in different locations around Queensland adds even further interest to our tournament calendar, and significant thanks must go to the organising committees and volunteers from the various associations who have supported and promoted all of these events.

Our QLD Schools event continues to succeed with the 2nd state final being a resounding success with participants from Rocky, Bundy, Mackay, Warwick and other parts of the state competing. The Para event also saw a slight increase from the inaugural event last year. TTQ are committed to both events for the future.

Finally, the end of 2016 also saw the Pan Pacific Masters Games being held on the Gold Coast, this being the first time table tennis was included for 10 years. While numbers were lower than we might have hoped for, it was pleasing to see table tennis return to the Games, and hopefully we can build on the event in future years.

In terms of membership, 2016 saw our overall numbers of registered players reaching 1790, this being again an increase on the previous year's membership of 1710. Again, within our member associations we have seen both increases and decreases in membership, which is obviously to be expected and the reasons vary from club to club. To those associations whose membership has waned, or remained at its previous level, I would urge you to try to determine any obvious reasons for the

decline, and where possible make necessary adjustments to your operations. Like any sport, we have other organisations actively competing for our membership, and we need to be active in ensuring that we are offering a service that is appealing to all of our members if we hope to retain them. Obvious areas of focus for all clubs are Junior development, and steadily increasing the numbers of female players, and it also goes without saying that we need all clubs to be accurate in the reporting of membership given its direct relationship to the securing of funding and sponsorship.

In an effort to provide a more quantifiable and transparent system for rankings, TTQ has been trialling during 2016 a new system where points are allocated to players for participation and performance in events during the year. The outcomes of this trial have been provided to Selectors for their consideration and feedback so that appropriate modifications can be made, and the revised system, prior to full implementation. In the long term we would like to see a system in place that encourages participation and performance in Queensland based events.

The system should also provide a clear justification for published Queensland rankings, and it will allow selectors to focus on team selections, which is and should be their primary role. Many thanks to Steve Mitchell, Jason Walsh and Danny Lloyd for the work they have done on this system so far. There will no doubt be some teething issues with the new system during 2017 but the Board is confident that in the long-term this system will be of significant benefit to table tennis in Queensland. We would obviously encourage constructive feedback from members in relation to the system.

Player achievements in 2016 were considerable, and these are outlined in detail later in the Annual Report, I would however like to make mention of a few notable performances. Without doubt our U18 Boys Team of Jake



Duffy, Benjamin Gould, Mateo Dvorani and Fred Xu had an outstanding year being named the Queensland Junior Sport Team of the Year at the Queensland Sports Awards, reflecting their Gold Medal team success at the Australian Championships, and numerous other achievements. Jake Duffy was also nominated for Queensland Junior Sport Star of the Year.

Other notable successes in Juniors included Matilda Alexandersson securing the U15 Girls singles championship at the Australian Juniors in Alice Springs, and Benjamin Gould winning the National Junior Top Ten Tournament. Jake Duffy won every gold medal available in the under 18 age group at the nationals. While both Jake and Benjamin went on to represent Australia at the World Junior Championships in South Africa. Such player successes obviously reflect years of dedication and training but I am sure the players would agree that thanks must also go to all of our parents, team managers and coaches for the great job they have done in supporting our players.

Finally congratulations must go to Andrea McDonnell from Townsville who represented Australia at the Rio Paralympics in September. Truly an amazing achievement that Andrea will remember for the rest of her life.

In the officiating area it was great to see Will Almasi, Lukas Kozak, Mark Patane and Zark Roksandic achieve their International Umpire accreditation, with Queensland continuing to be the leading state in Australia by far in terms of accreditation of umpires. Further in this respect, the Commonwealth Games Federation, in conjunction with the International Table Tennis Federation, have recently advised pre-selection of umpires for the Commonwealth Games, and Queensland is well represented in this announcement by Anthony Jeffress, Will Almasi, Lukas Kozak, Mark Patane, Zark Roksandic, Greg Dinsey, Kameron Chan, Nicole Udal, Andrew Martin and Kenneth Wong as

pre-selected umpires, and also John Sherriff as reserve umpire. Congratulations to all umpires on their pre-selection. There is little doubt that Queensland has continued to lead the way across the country with coaching and officiating courses regularly being held at various venues. This was reflected in Zarc Roksandic recently being named the Fran Keyhoe Table Tennis Australia official of the year for 2016. Dave Delpratt is also to be commended for his appointment as a Deputy Referee for the Rio Olympics in September.

Financially, as you will read in the Treasurer's Report, Table Tennis Queensland is in a sound position. Looking forward we have been able to secure a healthy increase in recurrent government funding for the next triennium along with a significant grant to assist in the development and staging of major events in regional areas of Queensland. The funding that has been provided will enable enhancement of the services that we are able to provide to our membership across the state, as well as improving our facility to deliver high standard events and training that will ultimately lead to further development of the sport of table tennis in Queensland.

We are very confident that as a consequence of the funding that has been provided we will be able to deliver very successful 2017 - 2019 Queensland State Junior, Youth, Senior and Veteran Championships, as well as the 2018 National Juniors event in Queensland. It will also enable us to deliver more regionally based tournaments, regular high performance training hubs for junior players, improved coaching standards, and further promotion of the sport in schools.

On behalf of the Board and membership of Table Tennis Queensland I am pleased to express our sincere gratitude to the State Government for the funding that has been provided to our organisation under the previous Queensland



Sport and Recreation Industry Development Program 2014-2016.

In advance thanks must go to Queensland Governments ongoing support through the State Development Program 2017-2019 and the Special Initiatives Funding related to our Championship Events application, also for the 2017-2019 triennium. I would also like to express sincere thanks to our Executive Officer (Jason Walsh), Administration Manager (Karen Carruthers), Treasurer (Joe Clifton) and other members of the Board of TTQ for your efforts in the management of our financial affairs during 2016.

To conclude, on behalf of the Board I would like to thank all members of Table Tennis Queensland for your contributions to our sport during the past year. It has been a very successful year, and with the up-coming Commonwealth Games and other possible international events in Queensland, we have plenty to look forward to in 2017 and beyond.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

INTRODUCTION

I'm pleased to report on a successful 2016 that continued on from the momentum established in a number of areas in 2015.

This was highlighted in an increase in membership, coaching/officiating courses conducted across the state, national championships success and the implementation of new initiatives such as the elite junior training hubs. A strong funding & financial standing has Table Tennis Queensland in a good position to capitalise on the upcoming opportunities in the coming years.

PARTICIPATION

TTQ membership increased from 1710 to 1790 in 2016. An in-detail summary of all club memberships can be found on page 20. Participation at state championships remained steady in comparison to previous years. A highlight was the increased participation and standard of competition at the Closed Championships in 2016.

PEOPLE

State Director of Coaching and High Performance Patrick Wuertz conducted a number of coaching courses throughout 2016. This included Tops courses in Townsville, Brisbane, Wynnum and the Sunshine Coast. Level 1 courses were conducted in Townsville and the Sunshine Coast. Overall the courses were very well subscribed, the course participants are now in the process of completing the requirements to attain their accreditation.

New umpire course presenter Will Almasi conducted two state umpire courses, these being in Townsville and Moreton Bay. These courses coincided with a national umpire course in early January 2017, a number of these participants have been identified to umpire at the Commonwealth Games in 2018. Special mention to Lukas Kozak, Mark Patane, Zark Rokсандic & Will Almasi on attaining their international umpire accreditation. Zark's achievements throughout 2016 were recently recognised by Table Tennis Australia, in which he won the Fran Keyhoe official of the year award. Dave Delpratt was a deputy referee at the Olympic Games in Rio, a special appointment at the largest event in the world, well done Dave.

I'd like to thank our course presenters Patrick, Will and the continued support from Dave Delpratt in delivering the accreditation courses. Unfortunately in late 2016 Patrick resigned from his position to take up full-time role in Victoria. TTQ wish Patrick



all the best for the future and thank him for his service in the role.

PERFORMANCE

2016 saw a number of outstanding performance by Queensland players on the state, national & international front. Congratulations to all players & coaches that represented Queensland throughout the year.

Some highlights from 2016 on the international stage included Andrea McDonnell representing Australia at the Rio Paralympics. Also Jake Duffy & Benjamin Gould representing Australia at the World Junior Championships. Fantastic achievements in recognition for all of your efforts.

Jake and Benjamin along with Mateo Dvorani and Fred Xu were also part of the Under 18 Boy's team that claimed the national title in Alice Springs. The team were incredibly also awarded the Queensland Junior Sports Team of the Year at the 32nd Annual Queensland Sports Award. Jake topped off an amazing year which included national under 21 & 18 titles by being a finalist for Junior Sports Star of the Year.

The under 21 Men's team won the National title at Seagulls, Tweed Heads. While Matilda Alexandersson won the national Under 15 girls singles title and Benjamin Gould also won a National junior top 10 event. Congratulations to all players on your achievements. Thanks must also go to all Queensland state team coaches for their continued support.

DEVELOPMENT

The state-wide elite junior training program was introduced in 2016. This provided junior players the opportunity to train in three regional centres (Northern, Central & Southern) on a regular basis. This program will again continue in 2017 with further expansion planned.

Relationships with disability providers such as Lifestream Australia continued to expand in 2016. This saw participation events conducted in Ipswich and Brisbane to provide opportunities to individuals with an intellectual disability. The special olympics continued to conduct regular events throughout the year. This has been capped off with the exciting news that table tennis will be part of the State Special Olympics games in 2017 on the Sunshine Coast.

State Development Officer Greg Fox continued to implement the Sporting Schools program across Queensland and assisted clubs with various other participation initiatives. This included a number of successful Come and Try days and Totally Table Tennis programs. This position is funded by Table Tennis Australia, and TTQ would like to express our gratitude to TTA for their support in this area.

EVENTS

TTQ continued to conduct the various state championships with the assistance of host associations. Over the last couple of years since this change has been introduced the state championships have provided a more consistent format, schedule and atmosphere for players.

The Queensland Schools Championships has continued to prosper with the 2nd annual state final and Para schools events conducted. In 2017 we will



see the schools championships being conducted in new regional centres.

The Women's National Table Tennis Challenge and Townsville Women's Come and Try event was conducted with the support of TTQ in 2016 with great success. These type of events will continue to be supported in coming years to increase women and girls participation in the sport.

COMMUNICATION

There was an increase in the number of subscribers to the TTQ newsletter 'Over the Net' again in 2016. There were 9 issues of the newsletter throughout the year. The newsletter included an increase in summary of outcomes from TTQ board meetings to ensure transparency on updates and decisions. TTQ is endeavouring to continue the current format in the coming years to maintain the increased level of communication with our associations and members.

The TTQ website and event online registration system were maintained with minor changes made to ensure they were user friendly. The website and facebook pages continued to grow in terms of visits and followers respectively.

GOVERNANCE

The 2016 Annual General Meeting (AGM) brought about some changes to the TTQ Board of Management with Katrina Forster not standing for re-election after being elected to the Table Tennis Australia Board of Management. Jason Hockings was elected to Northern Board Members position. Danny Lloyd resigned in June to focus on his business pursuits. Steve Mitchell vacated his Southern Board Member role and was appointed Vice-President. Martin Solomons was appointed the vacant Southern Board Member role. I'd like to thank Danny and Katrina for their significant contribution to the Table Tennis Queensland Board of Management.



TTQ received the amount of \$129,800 (+GST) in 2016 in Queensland Government funding via the Queensland Sport and Recreation Industry Development Program. A review of a number of operational tasks was completed throughout 2016. The focus of this review was the minimise expenses to maintain sustainability of various tasks. In summary this exercise was very successful and this will be reflected in future financial records. TTQ produced a surplus of \$928.00 in 2016.

SDP Special Initiatives Events: \$5,650 + GST


Cash Flow




AUDIT STATEMENT

DIRECTOR OF COACHING AND HP REPORT

Patrick Wuertz

The high performance program has experienced increasing recognition in 2016 in Table Tennis Queensland and is primarily driven by major player successes on Junior and Senior Level as well as a state wide performance orientated training program.

Junior Results

Jake Duffy won every gold medal possible in his age group at the 2016 Australian Junior Championships, including gold in the mixed doubles, the doubles and most importantly, the national title for the U18 boys singles event. In addition, the U18 boys with Jake Duffy, Mateo Dvorany, Benjamin Gould and Fred Xu marked a historical win with the gold medal of the U18 boys team. Other outstanding results were Matilda Alexandersson's 2 gold medals in the U15 singles and doubles.

Despite the bronze medal in the U13 girls event it is certainly one of TTQ's biggest challenges in the next few years to develop promising boys and girls who are able to compete on the highest level in the U13 and U15 age group.

Benjamin Gould was able to win the National Junior Top 10 tournament and secured his spot at the World Championships. It is remarkable that 2 out of the 4 players at the World Championships from Cape Town were from Queensland.

Role out of the new Training Hubs

Table Tennis Queensland recently rolled out their new training program to offer performance orientated junior players the opportunity to train at the highest possible level in their region. The regions were decided to be set as Northern, Central or Southern QLD training hub and offer weekend training camps every 2-3 months for up to 14 junior players. So far Queensland held 6 Training camps in Wynnum, Gold Coast, Bundaberg and Townsville. Almost 50 players participated and contributed to the exciting yet tiring training sessions. Apart from

the benefits of the on-table and off-table exercises for the players, the training camps have a positive influence on TTQ's training environment.

Coaching Courses

TOPS and Level 1 Coaching Courses were held in Brisbane, Wynnum, Townsville and the Sunshine Coast in 2017 with more than 40 participants overall. 2 Queensland Coaches, Franck Roguiez and Matthew Pettett joined the Level 2 Coaching Course in Melbourne and are about to finalise their accreditation requirements. A number of coaches also used the High Performance Training Hubs for their personal development and joined the training sessions as well as the informal coaching workshops during the weekend.

OFFICIATING REPORT

Dave Delpratt

The year was extremely busy and very successful with the highlight undoubtedly being the addition of four new International Umpires to Queensland's ranks. Congratulations go to Will Almasi, Zark Roksandic, Mark Patane and Lukas Kozak who all passed the exam at their first attempt. They now have the opportunity to attend the many international tournaments that are available in Australia, Oceania and around the world, not the least being the 2018 Commonwealth Games at the Gold Coast.

Congratulations go also to Zark who was named as the 2016 Fran Keyhoe Table Tennis Australia Official of the Year for his work throughout the year. His commitment to officiating over the last few years make this award a very fitting one indeed. Will Almasi is to be thanked, and congratulated, on the success of the two State Umpire courses he conducted, his first, in Moreton Bay and Townsville. Both were attended by seven participants who provided very positive feedback about the courses. A State Referee Course was also held in Brisbane later in the year, conducted by Dave Delpratt, with six participants. All the participants are working towards completing the requirements of the courses.

Recently accredited State Referees, Kenneth Wong, Will Almasi, Zark Roksandic and John Sherriff all successfully officiated at Queensland State and Open titles during the year, either as Referee or Deputy Referee, along with the more experienced Joe Clifton, Jim and Rhonda Miller and Lukas Kozak. This increase in Queensland's refereeing numbers and their decentralisation is important as the established officials reduce their workload or are involved in other tournaments.

Another very noteworthy event late in the year was the pre-selection of eleven Queensland umpires for the 2018 Commonwealth Games at the Gold Coast. While their final selection is still to be confirmed, the benefit is already being seen as several of these umpires are currently upgrading from being State Umpires to be National Umpires and therefore eligible for the Games. This of

course is in addition to the four who attained their IU status. Several other umpires, though not pre-selected for the Games, are also working towards becoming National Umpires so that Queensland will have one of the largest numbers of higher level officials in Australia. This can only be good for Queensland Table Tennis.

Many of these umpires had the opportunity to work at several international and national events throughout 2016, in particular at Seagulls Club at Tweed Heads. These tournaments again enhanced their experience and in several instances led to their Commonwealth Games pre-selection due to their strong performances. The Moreton Bay club must also be recognised for their continuing efforts to promote umpiring at all of their tournaments, in particular the Womens National Table Tennis Challenge at which all matches had official umpires, but also the club's Open Championships and the Veterans tournament where many matches were again under the control of official umpires. This is an outstanding effort by a club, one that all clubs should be trying to emulate.

On the international scene, Dave Delpratt was one of four Deputy Referees at the 2016 Rio Olympic Games, as well as being the Referee at several international events in Australia during the year. Whilst all of these achievements are a sign that that numbers of officials in Queensland are growing, gaining experience and attaining higher status, there is still an ever-present need to promote this facet of our sport to the general playing population, especially among junior and young adults they will become the next generation of umpires who can attend the ever-growing list of major tournaments that are held annually in and near Australia. All Queensland clubs should therefore do all that they can to recruit umpires from their membership.
