



## STATE REFEREE ACCREDITATION

### State Referee Accreditation Information

The Table Tennis Australia referee accreditation scheme starts at National Referee which is an intensive and in-depth course perhaps not best suited to training new inexperienced referees. Table Tennis Queensland recently created the state referee accreditation to introduce referees to coordinate state & local championships.

### State Referee Accreditation Requirements

To become a State Referee you will need to complete the following requirements

- ✓ A current accredited State Level Umpire
- ✓ A Current Member of TTQ
- ✓ A Current Blue Card

### Referee Training Course

To become a State Referee you will need to complete the following requirements

- ✓ Candidates will successfully complete the ITTF Basic Referee Course (State Referee Course)
- ✓ Candidates may attend the course without the State Umpire Accreditation but will be required to complete this umpire accreditation prior to accrediting as a Referee

### Referee Training Program and Assessment

Your Training Program and Assessment need to be completed within a maximum of two years from passing the ITTF Basic Referee Course

- ✓ Candidates will work as the deputy referee at two association open events
- ✓ Candidates will assume the duties of the referee at one association open event (under the care of an accredited referee) and will be assessed in their performance by an approved assessor.

### Currently Active State Referees

To establish this Accreditation, the Table Tennis Queensland Officiating Committee will prepare a list of currently active and experienced referees to be immediately awarded the State Referee Accreditation upon successful completion of the ITTF Basic Referee Course.

### State Referee Accreditation

Successful candidates will be presented with a certificate and a State Referee Badge to be worn whilst refereeing. We will also ensure to update the Table Tennis Queensland website to reflect all State Referee Accreditations.

### State Referee Reaccreditation

Existing State Referees will be required to renew their Accreditation every four years. Referees must be a current member of TTA, have refereed a minimum of four events in the four year period of accreditation and have kept their umpiring accreditation current to be re-accredited. Referees who have not fulfilled the above requirements should contact the TTQ Officiating Committee to agree a route for reaccreditation.
