



NOAS RE-ACCREDITATION AND UPDATING REQUIREMENTS

WHAT IS RE-ACCREDITATION AND UPDATING?

When an official is first accredited, they will receive from the Australian Sports Commission a confirmation letter and National Officiating Accreditation Scheme (NOAS) ID Card indicating expiry date for accreditation. Within the confirmation letter each official will be given a username and temporary password which will allow them to log onto the Sports Accreditation On-Line Website. This website will give each official the ability to check their individual details, print out their officiating certificate and download "Activity Sheets" which have now replaced the Log Books. Officials are expected to keep records of their officiating practice and education on these "Activity Sheets", as after four years officials are required to re-accredit. To be able to re-accredit officials need to complete updating activities as listed on the re-accreditation requirements during the 4 year accreditation period.

Updating ensures officials keep in contact with up-to-date techniques and officiating methods, and that all registered officials are "active" in the field.

HOW DO I RE-ACCREDIT?

1. Complete National Officiating Accreditation Scheme (NOAS) Activity Sheets – available from the Sports Accreditation On-Line Website. Ensure you have completed the required hours and points listed.
2. Send Activity Sheets and a \$22.00 cheque made out to "Table Tennis Australia" to your State Officiating Director for approval.
3. Included with your Activity Sheets and cheque should be a completed:
 - Personal Details Form (required for the NOAS database)
 - Signed Code of Behaviour form
 - Current Photo
4. Once these forms and Activity Sheets have been received by Table Tennis Queensland and approved by our State Officiating Director, TTQ will then pass these forms on to Table Tennis Australia who will then upload your information onto the NOAS database.

RE-ENTRY FOR INACTIVE OFFICIALS

Officials whose accreditation has expired more than 12 months ago, must re-apply for accreditation. Officials must have completed a minimum of the points required at their level of accreditation, and may be required to re-do certain aspects of the course. A letter detailing support for the official's re-accreditation must be provided by the State Officiating Director to the TTA office. TTA would consider special circumstances upon application in writing to the National Umpire & Referee Committee.
